ALLEN SACK, Ph.D., Co-founder of The Drake Group, was made a permanent voting member of the Board of Directors by unanimous vote of the Board in 2021, in acknowledgement of his 21 consecutive years of service as a leader of The Drake Group. Dr. Sack earned his Ph.D. in sociology from Pennsylvania State University and a B.A. from the University of Notre Dame where he played on the 1966 NCAA National Championship football team. Dr. Sack is a Professor Emeritus in the college of business at the University of New Haven where he taught for forty-one years. He also served as the Director of the federally funded Center for Athletes Rights and Education (CARE) in the early 1980s. CARE was co-sponsored by the National Football Players Association and the National Conference of Black Lawyers. Dr. Sack is the author of Counterfeit Amateurs: An Athlete's Journey Through the Sixties to the Age of Academic Capitalism and co-author of College Athletes for Hire: The Evolution and Legacy of the NCAA's Amateur Myth.

DONNA A. LOPIANO, Ph.D., is the President and founder of Sports Management Resources (SMR), a consulting firm that focuses on assisting scholastic and collegiate athletics departments and sports organizations in solving growth and development challenges. Dr. Lopiano also serves as an Adjunct Professor of Sports Management at Southern Connecticut State University. She was the Chief Executive Officer of the Women's Sports Foundation (1992-2007) and served for 18 years as the University of Texas at Austin's Director of Women's Athletics. Prior to Texas, Lopiano served as an Assistant Professor and Assistant Athletic Director at Brooklyn College of the City University of New York. Recognized as one of the foremost national experts on gender equity in sport, she has testified about Title IX and gender equity before three Congressional committees and has served as an expert witness in over thirty court cases. Lopiano received her bachelor's degree from Southern Connecticut State University, her master's and doctoral degrees from the University of Southern California and is the recipient of five honorary doctoral degrees.

DAVID HUGHES, Ph.D., is a Sports Industry Management (SIM) Faculty member and Capstone Advisor at Georgetown University and a Prairie View A&M University faculty member. In 2022 he was named as a "Leader in the Metaverse" by US Black Engineer and in 2019, while at Hampton University, Dr. Hughes secured a \$340,000 technology grant to start the first eSports initiative at an HBCU. He is a Morehouse College graduate and earned his Ph.D. from Prairie View A&M University. He has been nominated for Faculty Member of the Year, authored children's books that highlight HBCU accomplishments, was selected as an Emerging Scholar by the American Educational Research Association (AERA), and received certificates from Bloomberg in Business Market Concepts, the University of Pennsylvania for Race and Equity in Education, and from Hampton University for Executive Leadership training. He was named a Next Generation Leader by the NAACP and served as the Education Committee Co-Chair for the Atlanta branch of the NAACP and Secretary of the Houston Morehouse Alumni Association. In addition to his work in education and sports, David is the founder and CEO of the Give Black App, which is the world's first social impact financial technology (FinTech) app for Black philanthropic efforts for Black organizations.

WENDY PIERPONT, Ed.D., is a Learning Specialist at University of Oregon's Services for Student Athletes. Her professional focus is on academically underprepared students across all sports, working most intensely with freshmen who take courses in composition, education, and social sciences. Development of study skills and academic engagement is a priority for all UO athletes. Pierpont also serves as the Access Specialist in the unit and supports athletes who need accommodations and testing to get connected with accessible education on campus. She has served on University-wide and athletic department committees on diversity and inclusion and is part of the Behavioral Management Health Team, an athletic department group that works to support the mental health and psycho-social development of athletes. Pierpont received an MA in Education (Intersection of Sport and Education) and teaching credential from U.C. Berkeley, has taught middle school Special Education and Language Arts, and coached cross country for three years before returning to Berkeley for her doctorate. Her areas of interests are academic engagement, students at risk of failure, experiential and alternative education, and student-athlete identity. Most recently she served as the Associate Dean of Academic and Faculty Affairs and Clinical Associate Professor of Sports Management in the School of Professional Studies at New York Univ. Zotos is the former Director of Athletics at Drew University where she was responsible for the administration of 18 varsity sports programs during her 14-year tenure. Prior to serving at Drew, Dr. Zotos was the Women's Athletics Director William Smith College and Philadelphia Univ. and a faculty member at the Univ. of Texas at Austin. She was a head college coach for 12 seasons and a three-time Conference Coach of the Year. She is a prolific writer and speaker in the areas of coaches' employment and compensation systems, creating tiered athletic program models, coach evaluation, and Title IX. She is a recipient of a NACWAA regional and national Athletic Administrator of the Year award and a WLCS Nike Lifetime Achievement Award. Dr. Zotos is a member of the Drew Univ. B. DAVID RIDPATH, Ed.D., is a Professor of Sports Business at Ohio University in the College of Business. Dr. Ridpath has several years of practical experience in the sports industry and teaches classes in several relevant areas with a focus on Governance, Ethics, Leadership and Intercollegiate Athletics. His primary research areas include intercollegiate athletics administration, governance, and rules compliance with an emphasis on college athlete academic achievement and graduation rates. This includes the ethics and components of the NCAA legislative, enforcement, and governance process and the intersection of educationally-based sport development and delivery in the US with other developmental programs throughout the world. Dr. Ridpath is the author of Tainted Glory: Marshal University, the NCAA, and One Man's Fight for Justice and Alternative Models of Sport Development in America: Solutions to a Crisis in Education and Public Health. She served on the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Committee and chaired the NCAA Women's Basketball Issues Committee. She was honored by Women Leaders in College Sports with its Lifetime Achievement Award, inducted to the NACDA Hall of Fame, and is a recipient of the WBCA's Jostens-Berenson Lifetime Achievement Award. Murphy serves on the Kay Yow Cancer Fund Board of Directors and is the Chair of the Tennessee Tech Foundation Board of Directors. She is the former Athletics Director at the University of Denver, a former head women's basketball coach and is currently an adjunct faculty member at Tennessee Tech. In retirement, he acquires books in political science for Lynne Rienner Publishers and in political theory for the University of Rochester Press. He has been an Associate of the Tower Center for Political Studies at Southern Methodist University since 2010 and a Friend of the Library there. A self-taught expert in copyright law, he served on the copyright committee of the Association of American University Presses (AAUP) from 1972 to 2015, chairing it for twenty-four of those years. He served twice for three-year terms each time on the AAUP board of directors and was president in 2007-08. He received the AAUP's highest award in 1999. A swimmer in college for four years, Thatcher has been an active participant in US Masters Swimming since 1972, both as a competitor and member of its History and Archives Committee.
