

INTERCOLLEGIATE ATHLETICS BILLS FILED IN THE 119th CONGRESS 2025-2026 – Updated as of 9-1-2025

A. NIL/ATHLETE EMPLOYEE BILLS

- H.R.2688 "Protecting Student Athletes' Economic Freedom Act of 2025"
 Sponsor: McClain, Lisa C. [R-MI-9] To prohibit a student athlete from being considered an employee of an institution, a conference, or an association based on participation in certain intercollegiate athletics.
- H.R. 4312—"Student Compensation and Opportunity through Rights and Endorsements Act of 2025 – SCORE Act" Sponsors: <u>Guthrie</u>, <u>Brett [R-KY-02]</u> and <u>Bilirakis</u>, <u>Gus [R-FL-12]</u> To protect the name, image, and likeness rights of studentathletes and to promote fair competition among intercollegiate athletics, and for other purposes.
- <u>S.2147</u>—"College Sports Integrity Act" **Sponsor:** <u>Paul, Rand [R-KY]</u> To exempt intercollegiate athletic conferences and interstate intercollegiate athletic associations from the antitrust laws.
- H.R. 2663—"Restore College Sports Act" Sponsor: Baumgartner, Michael [R-WA-05] To establish the American Collegiate Sports Association, and for other purposes.
- H.R.3847— "Student-athlete Protections and Opportunities through Rights, Transparency, and Safety Act- SPORTS Act" McClain, Lisa C. [R-MI-9] Establish national standards for how college athletes can earn compensation from their name, image, and likeness (NIL) and strengthen academic, health, and financial protections for collegiate athletics.

B. ATHLETES' RIGHTS AND SAFETY

• **S.74**—"Fair Play for Girls Act" **Sponsor: Blackburn, Marsha [Sen.-RTN]** A bill to require the Attorney General to submit to Congress a report relating to violence against women in athletics.

C. NCAA REFORM, ENFORCEMENT, AND FINANCES

S.955 and H.R.3976—"NCAA Accountability Act of 2025" <u>Blackburn, Marsha</u> [Sen.-R-TN]/Booker, Cory A. [Sen.-D-NJ]* and <u>Kustoff, David [Rep.-R-TN-8]/Harder, Josh [Rep. D-CA-9]*</u> **BIPARTISAN COMPANION BILLS-ENDORSED BY TDG** Establishes due process requirements for the investigation of intercollegiate athletics rules violations.

D. SEX EQUITY

- <u>S.543</u> and <u>H.R.1183</u> 119th Congress (2025-2026) Fair Play for Women Act Sponsor: <u>Sen. Murphy, Christopher [D-CT]</u> and <u>Adams, Alma S. [Rep.-D-NC-12]</u> **ENDORSED BY TDG** To prohibit certain discrimination against athletes on the basis of sex by State athletic associations, intercollegiate athletic associations, and covered institutions of higher education, and for other purposes.
- Protection of Women and Girls in Sports Act of 2025; Sponsor: Rep. Steube, W. Gregory [R-FL-17] Passed:1-14-25 (prohibits school athletic programs from allowing individuals whose biological sex at birth was male to participate in programs that are for women or girls)
- Protection of Women and Girls in Sports Act of 2025; Sponsor: <u>Tuberville</u>,
 <u>Tommy [Sen.-R-AL]</u> <u>Failed:3-3-25</u> (prohibits school athletic programs from allowing individuals whose biological sex at birth was male to participate in programs that are for women or girls, girls, but bill is not identical to H.R. 28)
- H.Res. 47 and S.Res. 22— Resolution Concerning the National Collegiate
 Athletic Association policy for eligibility in women' sports; Sponsors: Rep.
 Steube, W. Gregory [R-FL-17] and Blackburn, Marsha [Sen.-R-TN] calls on NCAA
 to revoke its transgender student-athlete eligibility policy and require its member
 conferences to conform to a biological sex-based policy
- H.R.3917—Sponsors: Rep. Johnson, Dusty [R-SD-At Large] To prohibit the participation of males in athletic programs or activities at the military service academies that are designated for women or girls.
- H.Res.587 —Resolution encouraging all public, private, and charter high schools, colleges, and universities in the United States to establish and support flag football programs for girls, and for other purposes. Sponsor: Williams, Nikema [Rep.-D-GA-5]
- S.Res.295 and H.Res.536—Resolution supporting the designation of the week including June 23, 2025, as "National Women's Sports Week" to celebrate the anniversary of the passage of title IX and the growth of women's sports.
 Sponsor: Ernst, Joni [Sen.-R-IA] and Tenney, Claudia [Rep.-R-NY-24]

E. GAMBLING

- <u>S. 454</u> and <u>H.R.1141</u> "Gambling Addiction, Recovery, Investment, and Treatment Act GRIT Act" <u>Sen. Blumenthal, Richard [D-CT]</u> and <u>Rep. Salinas, Andrea [D-OR-6]</u> (award formula grants to states for gambling addiction programs)
- H.R. 1552—"Providing Responsible Oversight and Transparency and Ensuring
 Collegiate Trust for Student Athletes Act" or the "PROTECT Student Athletes Act"
 Baumgartner, Michael [Rep. R-WA] To prohibit proposition bets made with respect to the performance of a student athlete, and for other purposes.
